| COST OF CAMP: | \$75 per camper (if you have already paid the \$50 non-refundable deposit for 2020, we can apply that to this fee leaving a balance of \$25 per camper to be paid by July 6 <sup>th</sup> ); this cost is the same for our at home campers as we will still be providing the necessary supplies for your mission projects/small groups   |  |  |
| MEALS:        | No meals will be provided for or prepared by the camp; we ask that you send a bag lunch each day for each camper in a brown, paper lunch bag (which we will provide at check in) that has your camper(s)' names on it. These lunches will be put into coolers according to crew colors at drop off each morning. <b>NO PEANUT BUTTER OR NUTS OF ANY KIND IN LUNCHES PLEASE</b> . Water will be provided throughout the day with juice boxes offered at lunch |  |  |

SNACKS: Prepackaged, individually wrapped snacks will be provided by camp

#### WHAT THE DAYS LOOK LIKE:

So again, we're still working this part out with our ministry partners BUT for now:

### Mon 4-6pm

Parents drive through WITH ALL CAMPERS in the car; will verify emergency and medical info on each camper; each camper will get their crew armband put on; campers not participating on campus for the week can collect their camp packets with supplies for small groups and mission projects to do at home with mom and dad. In addition, we will invite those doing camp at home to check in on Facebook LIVE for the worship and teaching portion each day. No one will get out of their vehicle during this check in process.

## Tues – Fri

Parents will drive through and drop off/pick up their campers to/from staff who will then walk them to their designated crews/vehicles

Our K-2<sup>nd</sup> graders (red/orange crews) will remain on campus their days

All other crews will be on campus for worship, teaching small groups but then will travel to several of our ministry partners (as we've done every year) who are still accepting volunteer groups this summer. When they return to campus, they will participate in quiet time and games. Should we not get enough ministry partners/service projects, crews will take turns traveling and staying on campus creating mission projects.

### COVID-19 RESPONSE:

-We will be following the required and recommended guidelines that the NC Department of Health and Human Services have issued effective May 22, 2020 for all day camps.

-The health and safety of your camper and our staff is of utmost importance to us and we will strive to protect each and every one of them to the best of our ability; if any camper/staff member exhibit any signs of being sick, he/she will be isolated in a room with any siblings under staff supervision until he/she/they can be picked up

-We ask that if any of your campers or staff members exhibit any sick symptoms PLEASE keep the entire family home; again, this is for the safety of all of our campers, staff, and their families (symptoms of COVID-19 incl fever, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing-fever being classified as 100.4 or above)

-Providence City Church has hired a cleaning service certified in cleaning and disinfecting according to the NCDHHS Environmental Health Section guidelines; this service will be cleaning before camp; stringent cleaning will then be done during camp several times a day

-We will perform a daily health screening of each camper and staff member before camp starts; this includes asking a series of questions and performing temperature checks via a contactless thermometer as parents drive through to drop off their camper. Should a camper or staff member have a temperature of 100.4 or above, he/she will be asked to return home along with any siblings attending. Each camper will have their hands sprayed with hand sanitizer after exiting the vehicles

-Cloth face coverings will be provided but not required for all campers/staff. Coverings will be required on staff checking in Mon eve and each morning while taking temperatures

-Rigorous hand washing will happen several times a day along with the frequent use of hand sanitizer

-Social distancing measures will be followed as much as possible

-All campers/staff will be reminded to cough and sneeze in their elbows

-Should a camper/staff/camper siblings need to go home or remain at home due to sickness or has been sick prior to the first day of camp he/she can attend/return to camp after you can answer YES to ALL THREE of these questions:

1. Has it been at least 10 days since you first had symptoms?

2. Have you been without fever for three days (72 hours) without any medicine for fever?

3. Has it been three days (72 hours) since your symptoms have improved?
